

ACADEMIC MEDICAL ONCOLOGIST

The Division of Hematology and Oncology, Department of Medicine, St. Michael's Hospital, Faculty of Medicine, University of Toronto, Department of Medicine, is seeking a full-time ACADEMIC MEDICAL ONCOLOGIST, to join two our full-time and one part-time medical oncologists. The Division also includes four full-time and two part-time hematologists.

The successful applicant will devote approximately 75% of his/her time to the care of patients with solid tumours, with a primary focus on cancers of the breast and gastrointestinal tract. He/she will be expected to participate in clinical trials in these areas. The majority of the clinical work will be done at St. Michael's Hospital, but the candidate will be expected to help develop our growing collaboration with Princess Margaret Hospital, by establishing a clinical presence at that institution as well. The successful applicant's non-clinical time will be largely devoted to teaching residents and medical students.

The successful candidate must hold an MD degree, be certified or eligible for certification in Medical Oncology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and be licensed or be eligible for licensure in Ontario.

St. Michael's Hospital is a tertiary care teaching hospital fully affiliated with the University of Toronto. The successful applicant must be eligible for an academic appointment as a clinician-teacher at the University, at the level of Lecturer or Assistant Professor.
